## INFORMATION FOR UK NATIONALS IN PORTUGAL



## Registering as a resident:

- If you plan to reside in Portugal more than 3 months, under Portuguese law you are required to register as a resident.
- You must register as a resident in order to access services such as healthcare, schools and social security. You can also be fined up to €1500 if your paperwork is not in order.

## How?

- Register at your local *Câmara Municipal* (town hall) to obtain a *Certificado de Registo para cidadão da UE*, a registration certificate which is valid for 5 years.
- After 5 years, you can ask for a permanent residence certificate (Certificado de Residência Permanente para Cidadão da UE). This time you will need to apply to the immigration authorities (Serviço de Estrangeiros e Fronteiras - SEF). This is valid for 10 years.
